### Expressive Arts and Design Creating with Materials

#### 3- and 4- year olds

- Explore different materials freely, to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make.
- Develop their own ideas and then decide which materials to use to express them.
- Join different materials and explore different textures.
- Create closed shapes with continuous lines and begin to use these shapes to represent objects.
- Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.
- Use drawing to represent ideas like movement or loud noises.
- Show different motions in their drawings and paintings, like happiness, sadness, fear etc.
- Explore colour and colour mixing.

Taking seaside paintings and impressionist painters as a starting point, pupils investigate how mixing a wider range of colours contributes to different effects.  They explore surface texture when selecting and combining materials to make a mixed – media final piece.	Using storybook illustration as a stimulus, children to develop their mark making skills to explore a wider range of tools and experiment with creating patterned surfaces to add texture and detail to drawings.		Developing their ability to work with clay, children learn how to create simple thumb pots then explore the work of sculptor Rachel Whiteread and apply her ideas in a final piece that uses techniques such as cutting, shaping, joining and impressing into clay.		Responding to a design brief, children create a piece of art that represents their local area using a Map as their stimulus. They learn three techniques for working creatively with materials and at the end of the project, evaluate their design ideas, choosing the best the best to meet the brief.
