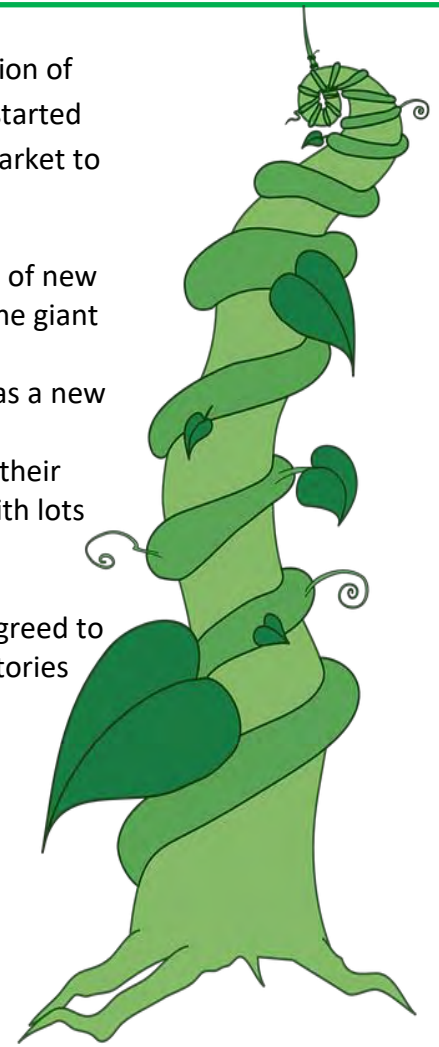




30 have been writing their own version of Jack and the Beanstalk. The stories started off with mum asking Jack to go to market to buy a pig.

The reception children very kindly agreed to listen to the children reading their stories and were great a great audience!

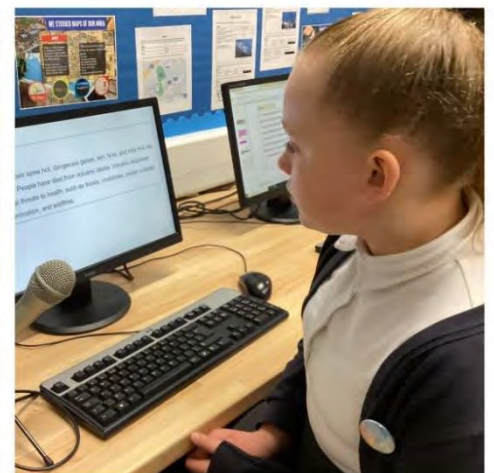
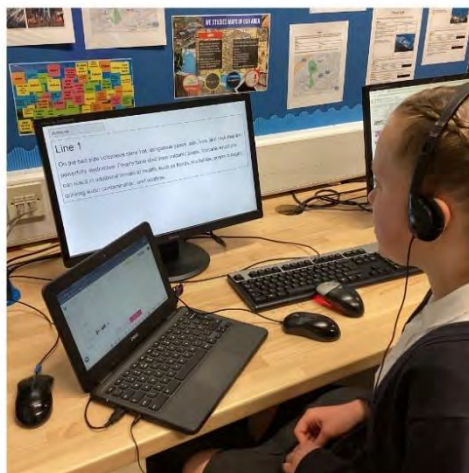
