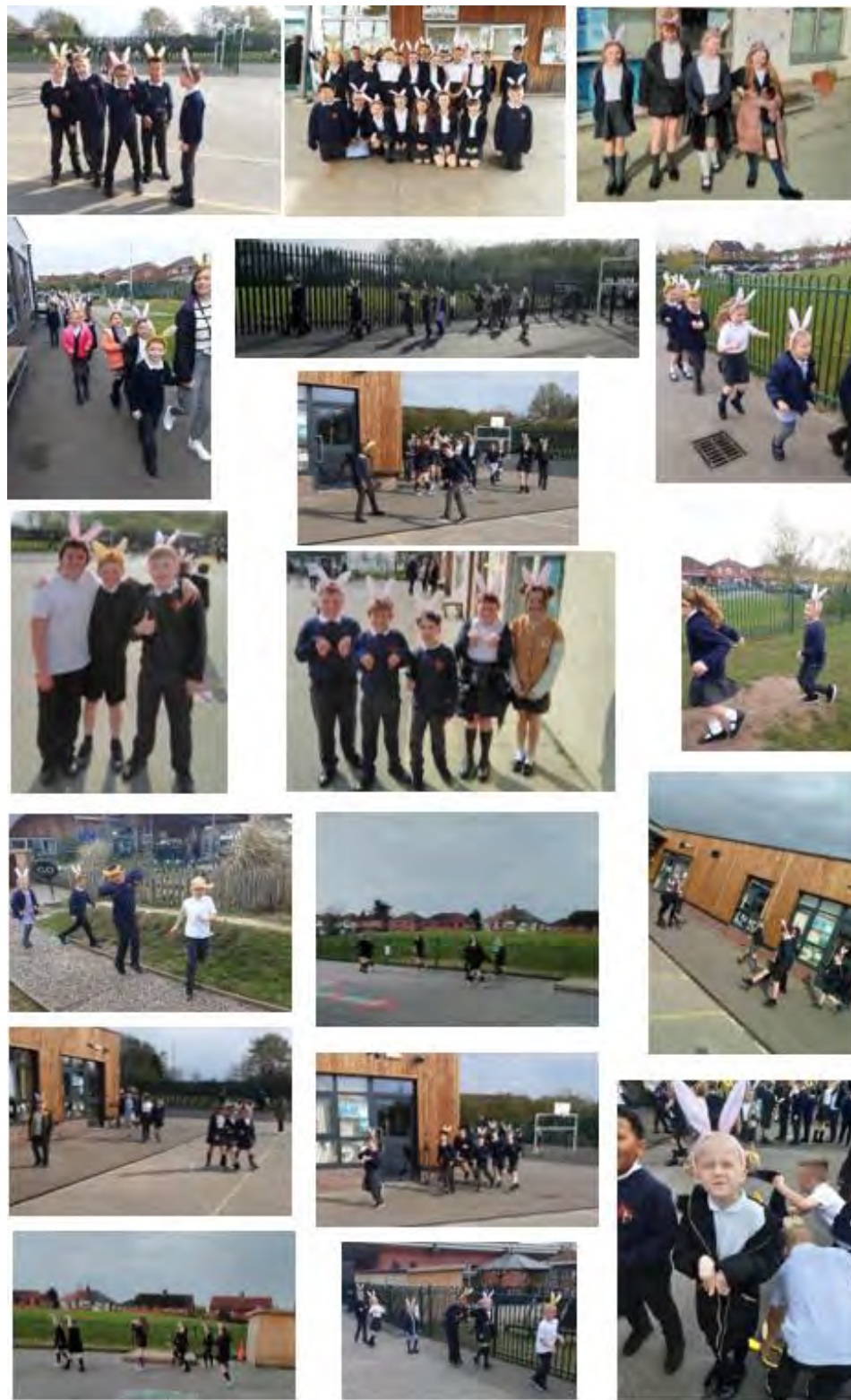
Sports News
