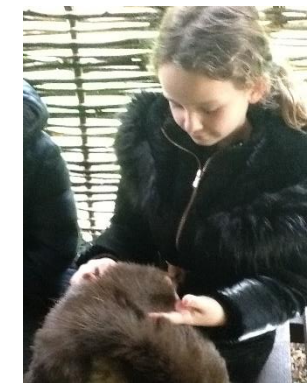
## Year 5 Tatton Park Anglo-Saxon Experience

## Young Shakespeare Company

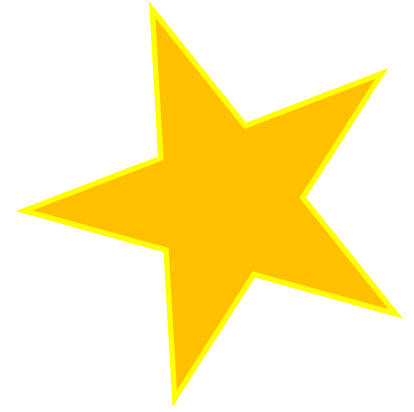
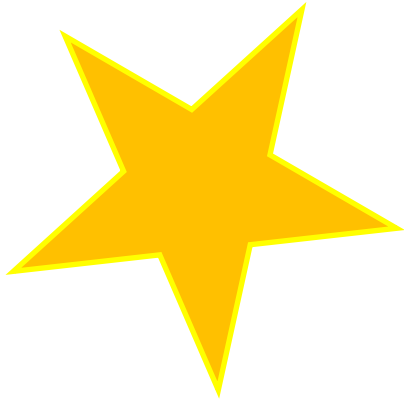

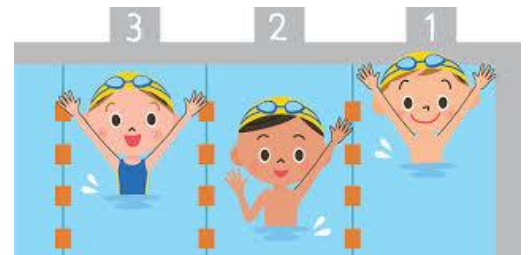

# Halloween Disco

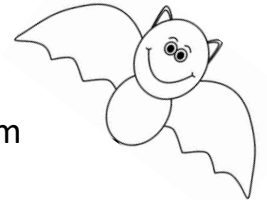
