We learned all about how the library works and how we can borrow up to 20 books, download eBooks, talking books, and comics using our library card. We can even use the computers.



Computer club started on Tuesday after school. This runs from 3:15 to 4:15 for children in Years 4, 5 and 6 and gives children a chance to explore all things IT.

This week we were using the BBC Microbit micro controller. Children soon got to grips with how to write and control this little device. We will be using their expertise when we introduce the Microbit into curriculum learning across KS2 after Christmas. The BBC Microbit is an important move forward in coding as it allows children to program and control real life devices such as timers, motors, controllers and alarm systems.







In History, Year 1 are learning about Guy Fawkes and The Gunpowder Plot. Their enquiry question for their History topic is - Why did The Gunpowder Plot happen?

The children learnt about King James I and generated questions to ask King James I. They took part in hot seating where they got to ask the King their questions.



Year 3 are enjoying reading 'How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth' by Michelle Robinson. On Wednesday, we worked together to wash some very messy animals. They needed scrubbing, brushing, shampooing and much, much more! Next week, we will be writing step by step guides to help others.

The children have been learning about Remembrance in class and we have taken several items of work over to Ryecroft Hall where they are displayed ahead of the Act of Remembrance this weekend.


Well done girls for sharing your passion for making a positive change. You all embrace our school values.




