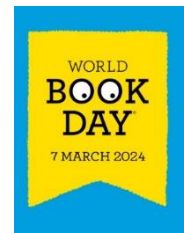
In Design and Technology this week Year 4 have started our 'Adapting a Recipe' unit. Making links with our English work about Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, we are going to be designing and making our own chocolate bars. The first step this week was to test and compare different chocolate bars that are available in the shops now. We used our senses to think of different adjectives about the appearance, smell, texture and taste of each of the samples. The children tested milk, dark and white chocolate, then orange and mint flavoured chocolate, and finally chocolate with added bits of honeycomb, popping candy and fudge. They enjoyed trying the samples and were very excited to try new varieties they hadn't had before. There were some super adjectives generated; silky, smooth, velvety, crunchy, tempting and indulgent.

We would like to invite all our children on this day to come to school dressed as a character from a well-loved book and will be taking part in story and literature-based activities throughout the day, with our work revolving around class novels and personal favourites.

In addition to this, we would also like to encourage everyone at home to get creative this year and make their own shoebox models of their current class novel to bring into school for the week of World Book Day. This is an optional task, but it would be lovely to see your children's creations as well as promote excellent reading and provide talking points for our classes.

Shoeboxes are a suggestion, but what we are basically after is a simple diorama which shows off something of the setting and the characters of the book which your child is currently studying in class - these can be found on the school website or just ask your teacher. It could be a famous scene, something memorable or a simple showcase of the characters, and can be made from any art materials that you can find at home (paper, paint, pipe cleaners, card, etc.)

Get creative. We can't wait to see what you come up with. We will be displaying this work around school and sharing our favourites across the Trust.

In one class, the lesson was about being safe online. We did an interactive quiz. They also showed us a film about why you should be careful online.

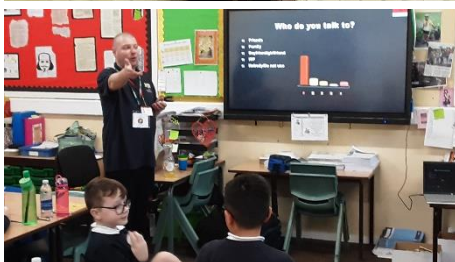
In another, we learned what a hate crime is and why they can be very dangerous. We also learned that you should always be accepted for who you are, no matter what you like. This group was about acceptance.

Measles



Measles is one of the most infectious diseases in the world.

This means it is easy to catch and easy to spread.



People can be very ill or even die from it.



If you get measles when you are pregnant, it can harm your baby.



But there is a safe vaccination that can protect you.
This leaflet tells you about it.



How Measles spreads

It spreads in the air when someone coughs or sneezes.



What are the symptoms?

High temperature and skin rashes.



What problems can Measles cause?

Adults, and babies (under 12 months) are more likely to have other problems with it.



In some cases Measles can cause chest infections, fits, swelling of the brain and brain damage.



Children may have to go to bed for about 5 days and miss about 10 days of school.



Vaccine

You will be asked by school or your Doctor to have your child vaccinated. **Please give your permission.**



The vaccine is called an MMR jab. It protects your child from Measles, Mumps and Rubella.



Your NHS states there is NO link between this vaccine and autism.



The vaccine is used all over the World and is as safe as any other

خسرہ اور MMR ویکسین کے بارے میں کچھ عام سوالات کے جوابات

کیا ویکسینیشن کوئی مضر اثرات ہونے لگے؟

آپ کے بچے کو ویکسینیشن کے بعد چھ ہفتوں تک خسرہ، ممیس اور رویلا کی علامات ہو سکتی ہیں لیکن بہت ہلکی شکل میں۔ اس سے ثابت ہوتا ہے کہ ویکسین کام کر رہی ہے اور آپ کا بچہ ان وائرسوں کے ساتھ مستقبل میں رابطے کے خلاف مزاحمت پیدا کر رہا ہے جو تین بیماریوں کا سبب بنتے ہیں۔ تمام بچوں میں یہ علامات ظاہر نہیں ہوتی لیکن اس کا مطلب یہ نہیں کہ ویکسین کام نہیں کر رہی۔

کیا پھیلنے والے علاقوں میں والدین کو خسرہ سے بچانے کے لیے لگوانا چاہیے؟

بہت سی بیماریوں کی طرح، ایک بار جب آپ کو خسرہ ہو جائے تو آپ دوبارہ میں مبتلا نہیں ہوتے کیونکہ آپ نے اس کے خلاف قدرتی مزاحمت پیدا کر لی ہے۔ لہذا، اگر آپ نے خسرہ یا MMR ویکسین کے دو ڈوز لے لیے ہیں تو آپ کو ابھی ویکسین کروانے کی ضرورت نہیں۔

ہمیں خسرہ کی اس وبا کا سامنا کیوں ہوتا ہے؟

خسرہ ایک انتہائی متعدی بیماری ہے، جو ایک شخص سے دوسرے شخص میں تیزی سے پھیلتی ہے، خاص طور پر اسکولوں میں۔ خسرہ میں مبتلا بچہ تقریباً ان تمام غیر محفوظ بچوں کو متاثر کرے گا جن سے وہ رابطہ کرتے ہیں۔ 2017 کے آخر سے عالمی سطح پر خسرہ میں اضافہ ہوا ہے جس نے برطانیہ کو متاثر کیا ہے۔ اس کے نتیجے میں یہ بعض وسیع برادریوں میں پھیل گیا ہے، خاص طور پر ان گروپوں میں جن میں ویکسین نہیں کی گئی ہے۔

MMR ویکسین عام طور پر کب دی جاتی ہے؟

بہترین اوقات 12 ماہ کی عمر کے درمیان ہیں اور دوبارہ تین سال اور چار ماہ کے درمیان، ہر موقع پر ایک ڈوز کے ساتھ۔ لیکن، اگر آپ کے بچے کو اس وقت ویکسین نہیں لگائی گئی ہو، تو اسے کسی بھی عمر میں ایک ماہ کے وقفے سے دو ڈوز کے ساتھ ویکسین لگائی جا سکتی ہے۔



خسرہ

اپنے بچے کو اس میں مبتلا ہونے نہ دیں۔
انہیں MMR ویکسین لگائیں۔

- خسرہ ایک بہت سنگین بیماری ہو سکتی ہے، جس سے کان اور سینے میں انفیکشن، دورے، اسہال، اور دماغ کو نقصان پہنچ سکتا ہے۔
خسرہ جاننے سے بچ سکتا ہے۔
- آپ کے بچے کو خسرہ کا خطرہ لاحق ہے اگر اس نے MMR ویکسینیشن نہیں کروائی ہے۔
- بہترین تحفظ حاصل کرنے کے لیے MMR ویکسین کی دو ڈوز درکار ہیں۔
- اگر آپ کے بچے کو MMR کے دو ڈوز لگنے والے ہیں لیکن اسے ابھی تک نہیں ملے ہیں، چاہے وہ کتنی ہی عمر کا کیوں نہ ہو، آپ کو اپنے جی پی سے رابطہ کرنا چاہیے تاکہ اسے جلد از جلد ویکسین لگوائیں۔*
- اگر آپ کو یاد نہیں کہ آیا آپ کے بچے نے MMR ویکسین کی کوئی، ایک یا دو ڈوز لے لی ہیں، تو اس کا ذاتی جانلڈ ہیلتھ ریکارڈ (ریڈ بک) چیک کریں۔ اگر اس سے مدد نہیں ملتی تو اپنے جی پی سے بات کریں۔
- اگر آپ نہیں جانتے کہ آپ کے بچے کو کتنے ڈوز لگے ہیں، تو بہتر ہے کہ اب MMR ویکسین کی دو ڈوز دیں بجائے اس کے کہ اسے غیر محفوظ رہنے کا خطرہ لاحق ہو۔
- مکمل کرنے میں کبھی دیر نہیں ہوتی۔ تمام بچوں اور نوجوان بالغوں کو MMR ویکسین کے دو ڈوز دیں۔ یہ کسی بھی ایسے شخص کی حفاظت کرتا ہے جو بہت کم عمر، حاملہ یا بہت کمزور ہے جس کو MMR ویکسین دی جائے۔
