This makes it easier to decide if some numbers appear more often than others and if the spin is truly random.


















All children throughout school will take part in the fundraiser on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> March 2024.


Children should all now have brought home a sponsorship envelope to gather sponsors from those in a position to donate.
