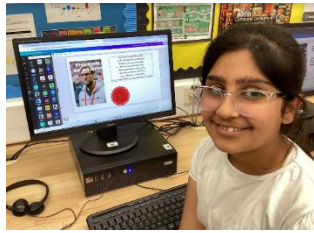
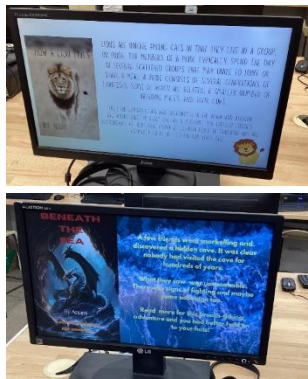

Year Five in the Spotlight

In Design Technology we have been building truss bridges this week. The children worked brilliantly in their teams showing great teamwork skills. The final results are going to be tested to find out how much weight they can hold.



In computing the children have been dipping their toes into Generative AI which is a technology that can produce various types of content, including text, pictures, and audio. Children had to think of a book they would like to write and then produce a book cover using AI and write a review of their own book. It was amazing how many different book covers children produced. This was completed using Canva, an online design and publishing tool with a mission to empower everyone in the world to design anything and publish anywhere.



In Geography, Year 5 have been learning about the Mediterranean Region and sampling some delicious foods from Greece. These included pitta bread, hummus, olives, feta, dried fruits, and tzatziki - yum!



Last week, the Year 6 Netball team who qualified for the final went up to Inspire Academy for the finals event. They played 3 games against the other heat winners. The first game against the winners, St. Mary's, was 4-2 at half time and a motivating team talk brought it back to a 4 all draw at the end of the game. We then played against Inspire which was a close game, but we lost 6-4 and finally we played Poplar St which we won 5-1. The team played brilliantly working together really well as a team. The scores were very close, but we came 2nd overall in Tameside.

On Friday 17th the whole school took part in the big dance to help as part of our work to raise awareness for mental health. Movement and getting outdoors is such a great way to help our mental health.

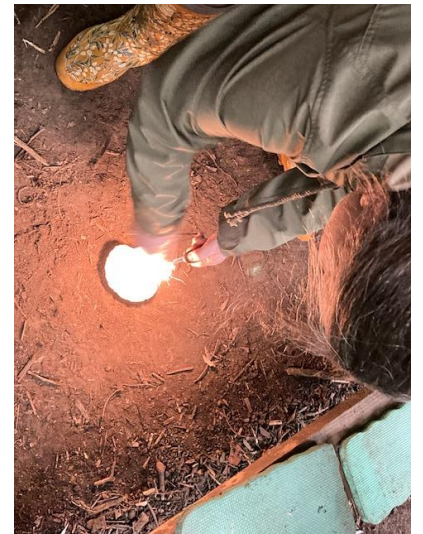

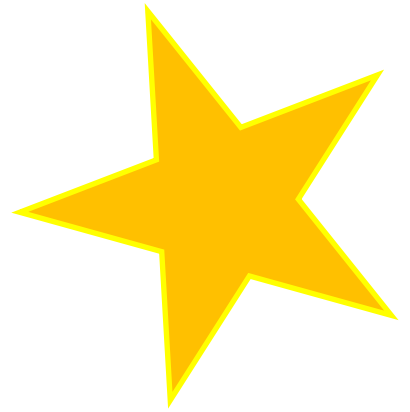
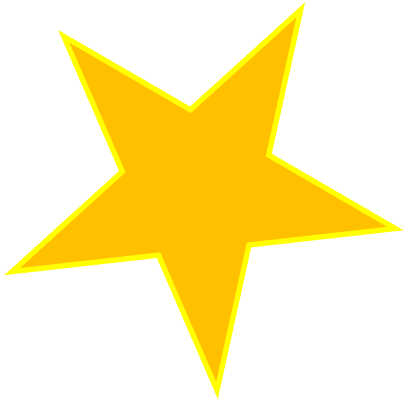
