

Year One

We have been reading a new book called 'The Bog Baby' and have been very excited when we found a Bog Baby trail in the allotment! We have been talking about whether the girls in the story should tell mum about the Bog Baby. We also performed drama in the form of a conscience alley on whether the girls should keep it as a pet.







Year One have been learning about multiplication and counting in twos, fives tens. The children extended this work by learning about arrays and problem solving. Well done Year 1!

In Design Technology in Year 2, we have been learning about mechanisms. We have looked at the different features of a wheel and learnt new vocabulary like "axle". Last week, we designed a Ferris wheel and this week, we made it using cardboard for the stand, straws for the wheel, lolly sticks for the axle and yogurt pots for the pods. We had to work as a team - discussing with our group which materials would make the structure the strongest. Here are some of our fantastic creations!



In English, 5C have been enjoying stories written by Hans Christian Andersen. Yesterday, we read The Brave Tin Soldier and reenacted key parts of the story using roleplay and freeze frames.





This term Year 5 have been learning about the 5 pillars of Islam and how they help and support Muslims through their journey of life.

This week we have been learning about the second pillar: Salah. The children have been learning about the prayers Muslims perform as their daily ritual and designing their own prayer mats.



Year 3 have been using the chrome books in geography this week to research information about England so they can compare it to Brazil.





Year Six has been taking a close look at Spreadsheets. They are learning about how a spreadsheet works and adding data and numbers. They learn how to format that data so it is more readable to the viewer and start to total columns of numbers using formulas.

The children quickly learn that when working with large amounts of numbers spreadsheets can save them a huge amount of time!





As part of their Canva Bootcamp Year 5 has been producing advertisements. The children choose one of their favourite products and create an advertisement, much the same as you might see in a newspaper or magazine. They are working as if they have been employed by an advertising company to launch a new campaign. They need to think about a slogan to sell that product, the graphics they will use and the product itself.



Today a team of Y3 and 4 girls travelled to MCFC to take part in a football tournament. The team played amazingly well, conceding only 1 goal throughout the tournament, and scoring 11 goals across the 5 matches. Caitlin, Darcie, Delcie, and Amelia scored brilliant goals and the team dominated throughout the tournament, just missing out in a place in the finals with a super strike from the opposing team in the last 20 seconds of play. The girls were great ambassadors for the school and the sport showing great teamwork between each other, but also sportsmanship and support to the other teams. Well done everyone, we are proud of you.


