This week, Year 1 have been learning to develop an understanding of mark making.

To do this, they have experimented with different marks and used marks to show texture, understand the importance of looking carefully and closely when they are drawing and used one type of drawing tool in lots of different ways. STUNNING!

Year Three have been recreating the Roald Dahl book "George's Marvelous Medicine" which was published in 1981. The story is about a boy named George who creates a magical medicine for his grandma. Children have been working through the story bit by bit and adding short sections to pages on Google Slides. This is a cross-curriculum lesson which brings together the love of books, spelling, typing, formatting skills and IT. They have also been using AI image generation to describe and create the illustration for each part of the story.



George lives on a small farm with his Mum, Dad and his Grandma.



As part of our e-safety lessons Year 6 have been designing their own social media site. This gives them a chance to focus on safety and guidelines (something we have been talking about during the lessons), who the social media platform is aimed at and how you might be able to make money out of it. Children have come up with some really fantastic ideas from "Talk Around The World", a social media platform to bring together different communities, to a site that give subscribers direct access to premier league football players. Children have been using AI to help them create logos for their new platform. But as you can see and children soon find out, AI can produce some odd results.





The stories

Here at 500 Words, we want children to have fun writing their stories, be as creative as they can and make us laugh, cry or just be blown away by what we are reading. Children are encouraged to write a story they would love to read themselves. Over the years there have been incredible stories submitted.

Children can only submit one story each. There are very few rules on 500 Words but a few points to remember:

All the stories must:

- Be 500 words or less (title is not included in the number)
- Be written by an individual and not a group
- Be a child's own original idea
- Be prose, not rap or poem

Stories must not:

- Give any personal details of the child, including their name
- Recount an historical event (but they can use a real person or historical character as a source of inspiration)
- Be created, written or developed by AI

All stories will be judged on the following criteria:

- Characterisation
- Plot
- Originality
- Language
- Enjoyment
