

Theme - Rock On!


Our topic theme for this half term is called Rock On! This is a science and history based theme, where we will be learning about rocks and fossils and about life in prehistoric Britain. Our English work is also linked to the theme.

What will we read this half term?









How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth by Michelle Robinson is a step-bystep guide to this mammoth task of cleaning this animal. We will be using one of our reading gems to predict what will happen in this interesting text. Stone Age Boy is a wonderful story about a time travelling young boy who has exciting adventures with his new friend Om. Stone Age Bone Girl tells the amazing real-life story of Mary Anning and her achievements in Lyme Regis. Through reading This Little Pebble, we will learn about rock cycles and the journey that a small rock has been on.

We will also be reading a range of non-fiction texts about Prehistoric Britain.


What will we learn this half term?

Our School Values

Achieve Care Value Listen Help

Our focus for this half term's value is 'Achieve'. We will be learning about the life and achievements of the great palaeontologist Mary Anning, and how her determination to succeed from a young age made her one of the most successful female fossil hunters in history.



English

In English, we will be looking at the key features of an instructional text based on the book How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth. We will be making our own woolly mammoths, then writing a detailed instructional text for how to make one. We will then move on to writing a story using Stone Age Boy as a starting point. During whole class reading activities, we will continue to look at the Reading Gems which are skills we use as a reader. The Reading Gems are: predict, decode, summarise, relate, compare, infer, retrieve, define, explore and, above all, enjoy.

We will continue to practise weekly spellings. This half term we are looking at the different rules for creating adverbs using the suffix –ly.

Maths

In maths, over the next few weeks, we will learn:


- Addition
- Subtraction
- Estimating
- Problem solving
- Multiplying and dividing by 3
- The 3x table
- Multiplying and dividing by 4
- The 4x table
- Multiplying and dividing by 8
- The 8x table



Science - Rocks and Fossils



In our science work, we will be learning about different kinds of rocks and how they compare and can be grouped. We will be answering the question – How are fossils formed? As well as looking at the fossil hunter, Mary Anning.



Research Topic

History – From the Stone Age to the Iron Age

We will be travelling back in time to prehistoric Britain where we will be finding out what life was like during the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. Through questions, including 'How did hunter-gatherers survive in Stone Age Britain?' and 'Why was Stonehenge built?' we will be looking at the evidence and answering the questions.



<u>Art</u>

In art, we will be discovering how and why our ancient ancestors made art, experimenting with natural materials to make homemade paints and playing with scale to paint on a range of surfaces. We will look at historical evidence from cave painting and creating our own line drawings.

PSHE

We will be celebrating differences and the fact that everyone is different. We will be looking at family, anti-bullying, problem solving, being kind and giving and receiving compliments.

Music

This is a six-week Unit of Work that introduces the children to learning about the language of music through playing the glockenspiel.

The learning is focused around exploring and developing playing skills using this percussion instrument.



PE

This term we will be working with Mr Cole, our P.E. coach and developing our skills in the sport 'handball'.

RE

For RE, we will be exploring why festivals are important to religious communities. This will include looking at the Hindu festival of Diwali, the Muslim festival of Eid-Ul-Fitr and the Christian festival of Christmas.



Foreign Languages

This half term in French we will start by learning four important sounds that will help us have super pronunciation when we are talking. We will then learn the vocabulary for 10 animals, and be able to say and understand the sentence "Je suis..." (I am..). In the weeks leading up to Christmas we will research how the festive season is celebrated in France and other French speaking countries.





Computing

This half term, we will continue to refine our word processing skills to create information texts about life in the Stone Age through to the Iron Age. We will be researching information online that we can add to our work as well as finding and inserting pictures to go alongside the text.

Homework

Homework will continue to be given out each Friday. This should be returned by the following Wednesday. The spelling and times table book (pink book) only needs to brought into school on Fridays. Please continue to support your child's reading by listening to your child read or through sharing books.
