Year 3 went on a trip to RHS Bridgewater on Tuesday. We were very lucky that the weather stayed fine and a great time was had by all.

The children took part in a workshop about seed dispersal. This was a lot of fun as both Grayson and Carter dressed up as flowers to demonstrate the life cycle of a flowering plant.

We even got to see some seeds that can walk on their own!

As well as planting our own lettuce seedlings, we also got to see some of the beautiful gardens and have a play on the adventure playground and in the den building area.



This week, Year 5 stepped back in time to experience life during World War II by baking wartime carrot biscuits. The children learned how families had to make do with limited ingredients and get creative with what was available. They chopped, peeled and grated carrots, and mixed the ingredients by hand to create the biscuits. The activity also formed part of their Design and Technology unit on developing a recipe and exploring the journey of food from farm to fork. It was a fun, hands-on way to appreciate the resourcefulness of people during the war.



This term, Year 4 are diving into the magical world of 'Traditional Tales.' This week, we have read and discussed familiar stories such as Little Red Riding Hood, Jack and the Beanstalk, and The Three Little Pigs. We have identified the key features that make these tales timeless, like memorable characters, clear moral lessons, and classic story structures.

Building on our understanding, we will then take on an exciting challenge: transforming a traditional tale into a playscript! We will learn how to adapt a narrative into dialogue, including stage directions, and think about how the characters might come to life on stage. We will then perform our playscripts to year 2.

Our Aldwyn Y1/2 sports team needs your help!


Do you know a business that would like to sponsor our Y1/2 school sports team so they can look the part as well as play the part?



The Squid Squad

SPONGEBOB SQUAREPANTS meets BUNNY VERSUS MONKEY in this hilarious, zany and action-packed full-colour graphic novel for readers aged 5-8. Join naughty best friends Ollie the vampire squid and Zing the toxin-squirting sea bunny as they cause chaos in the deep sea with the rest of their undersea crew!

Ollie and Zing live in a town called Nowhere, deep under the sea – a place that's home to the wackiest and weirdest creatures of the ocean, like the stinky Blob, crafty Hypno-snail, and the mysterious Snakey Unicorn Thing... Ollie and Zing's antics with their colourful neighbours always keep things lively – especially when they get the better of dastardly old Thornelius, the thorn-shooting sea slug!

This book contains four hilarious mini episodes, featuring a missing pet sea anemone (who makes a dashing wig), a very mysterious noise, and a magical portal toilet...

Aoife's striking, bold and friendly art style welcomes even less confident readers in these action-packed mini episodes. Hilarious and anarchic visual humour with a loveable cast of vibrant characters. A celebration of imagination, friendship and being completely unique!
