This week in Year 6, we have been enjoying our first book for English lessons. This is 'The Barnabus Project' and we have all loved the story. 'The Barnabus Project' is about a group of pets who have been designed in a laboratory to be sold in pet stores. Barnabus is said to be a failed project because he doesn't come out cute enough. The book has raised a couple of interesting questions and ideas, such as - 'Is it right to use animals for scientific research?' Year 6 have debated this topic and have written some fantastic balanced arguments, shared their thoughts and used their voices to put forward opinions that they believe in. We've been really happy with the speaking and listening on display.







In R.E, Year 5 have been learning about Christian beliefs about God. We read a special story in Isaiah Chapter 6, from the Old Testament, where Isaiah is called to be God's messenger. The children used their imaginations to create some amazing artwork to show what this moment might have looked like.









We are so proud of how well the children have settled into their new class and routine.

They have made new friends and have enjoyed exploring all areas of the classroom especially the outdoor environment even in the rain!

Miss Hutton's class also had their first visit to Forest School where the children had a fantastic time.

This week we have started the topic 'Down the Farm'. Our first text is I Love Animals, the children made wonderful animal actions and sounds when orally describing which animal they like best.

Next week the children will be painting and drawing their favourite animals and beginning the story, What the Ladybird Heard.

We are looking forward to the exciting activities we have planned linked to the text.

Year 1 and Year 2

At Aldwyn Primary we've developed an intuitive Al-powered app designed to help young children learn keyboard skills in a focused, distraction-free environment. The app begins with a simple "find the letter" activity, gradually progressing to typing 100 high-frequency words and then constructing sentences using those words. Each step reinforces recognition and typing accuracy, with children prompted to find the correct letter before moving forward—ensuring mastery through repetition and engagement. With no unnecessary visuals or sounds, the app keeps learners on task, making it an ideal tool for early literacy and keyboard fluency.

Our Year Four students have been working hard to deepen their understanding of place value, using base ten blocks to explore how numbers are built and broken apart. This hands-on approach made abstract ideas more concrete, allowing the students to explain their thinking with confidence and apply their knowledge in new ways. Their enthusiasm and teamwork have been fantastic to see, and we are very proud of the progress they are making!









Our young disciple's dove into the Gospel story of the Miraculous Catch of Fish this week. In an engaging oracy task, each child stepped into the shoes of Matthew, sharing from his perspective while their partner asked thoughtful questions. A wonderful way to deepen understanding through role-play and reflection!



Good attendance and punctuality continue to be a priority at Aldwyn. We have an ambitious target for whole school attendance of 97%. We have made a great start to this term and our attendance for this week is only slightly below the target. Good attendance can be achieved by all when families and schools work well together.

- If your child is slightly under the weather, still send them into school children often start feeling better as the day goes on and they get busy, and if the school is worried, we will call you.








Attendance for this week = 96.3%



Aldwyn Book Corner

Ready for Spaghetti

Michael Rosen & Polly Dunbar



From two of the biggest names in children's publishing, this is an inspiring guide to wordplay for young readers, their parents and teachers.

I'm ready for spaghetti Will you getti the spaghetti? Don't say, "Not yetti spaghetti!" 'cos I'm all setti for spaghetti.

Fizzing with rhythm, energy and laughter, the 30 poems in Ready for Spaghetti delight in the details of children's daily routines. "Up, up, uppity-up!", the first poem announces, while the artwork shows a child leaping out of bed, ready to begin their morning; "Hush and a hush, soft and low", chants the final poem, as children snuggle under their blankets after their day's adventures. Full of affectionate observations of young children, which are beautifully continued in Polly Dunbar's warm-hearted pictures, Michael Rosen's poems are ideal for reading aloud with toddlers ... and many grown-ups will soon know them by heart!

Our Review Panel says...

<u>Michael Rosen</u> is a master of the word. He is a master of rhythm and rhyme and a master of the engagement of young children. This book is full of poems specifically aimed at the youngest children. It recognises that enabling children to hear and feel words in an enjoyable and engaging way, is not just a foundational skill for learning to read and write, but a fundamental entitlement for all children to be able to be introduced to the joy of playing with words.

The poems and rhymes follow the loose structure of a child's day from the rhyme "Up" at the start to "Goodnight" at the end. In between come rhymes that can accompany all sorts of activities, such as "On the swings" and feelings, like the rhyme "Happy". The rhymes are simple and easily recalled, but the joy for the child will also be in the illustrations by Polly Dunbar. Pictures of children illustrate each rhyme – my particular favourite is the illustration of the child 'putting on' her pyjamas to accompany the rhyme, "Jimmy Jams".

Children will quickly know their favourites and, in no time, will be reading along with the adult.




