This week, Year 2 have been learning all about what makes our local area so special. Using Google Earth, we explored Audenshaw from a bird's-eye view before switching to 3D images, which helped us recognise familiar places and features.

Together, we spotted and identified a range of human features such as houses, shops, churches, schools, and roads, as well as physical features like parks, trees, and fields. To make our work even more exciting, we created our own map symbols to represent these features.

We really enjoyed seeing where we live from a new perspective and discovering how geography and maps can help us understand the world around us.

Google Gemini is a brilliant chatbot that answers any question children might have—safely and privately.

Google AI Studio offers a playground of AI models that allow children to create images, videos, and even apps, all in a secure environment where their creations remain private.

Children also have access to the fantastic Canva which is crammed with safe AI. We encourage all our learners to explore these tools responsibly and creatively!





## **Aldwyn Book Corner**

#### The Mushroom of Doom!



Mushroom is having the worst day EVER. First, he's not picked to go on the pizza (and Pineapple is chosen instead of him – can you BELIEVE it?! PINEAPPLE!). Then, Milk spills all over him. And then he's thrown in the compost bin. The indignity! I know exactly what you're thinking . . . it's time to build a mushroom army and take revenge!

A laugh-out-loud picture book with the message that revenge never pays.

#### Our Review Panel says...

This is a remarkably sophisticated picture book with a great sense of humour on every page, through the words and the pictures.

A story of revenge and how it never pays, filled with humour that an adult can also enjoy, with references to Bond villains and plenty of wordplay (he's not only the Mushroom of Doom but also a *fun guy!*). The pictures are entirely in keeping with the zany plot, and giving mushrooms distinct personalities takes skill. A wonderful, ambiguous ending also means there is plenty to discuss in this story. The Mushroom is a stereotypical villain who may, or may not, get his comeuppance and a character who appears to fail to learn from his mistakes and the kindness of others.

It is rare to find a picture book that makes me laugh out loud as this one did. The very idea of a Mushroom as a villain will make readers of all ages intrigued to read the book, and this mushroom did not disappoint.
