Year One had a very special visit this week from the star in our story *The Star in the Jar!*

The children loved meeting the star and asked thoughtful questions about what it is like to live in Space. They were delighted to discover that stars enjoy eating galaxy cheese and drinking galaxy milk!

This exciting visit gave the children a wonderful opportunity to practise their oracy skills and develop their spoken language. A very special well done to Aldo for his brilliant drama skills in bringing the star to life — fantastic work!



## Year 2 Dive into Learning with *The Secret of Black Rock!*

Year 2 have plunged into an ocean of discovery while reading *The Secret of Black Rock*. Their curiosity was sparked by the incredible variety of sea creatures in the story, inspiring them to explore real marine life in even greater depth.

Using Chromebooks, the children became young researchers, gathering fascinating facts about different sea animals before typing up their findings in Google Docs. Their hard work didn't stop there — Miss Sutton transformed their writing into a beautifully printed class book, complete with a front cover, giving the children the thrill of seeing their digital work turned into a real, tangible book they could hold and read.

This project is a fantastic example of cross-curricular learning in action. It blends reading, science, technology, and writing, showing children how different skills connect and come to life in meaningful ways.

A huge well done to Year 2 for their enthusiasm, creativity, and brilliant teamwork!





This week in maths, Year 4 have been learning how to multiply 2 -digit and 3 -digit numbers by a 1-digit number. We explored how the distributive law helps us break numbers into smaller, manageable parts (for example, partitioning into hundreds, tens and ones) to make multiplication easier and more accurate.

The children then used this understanding to practise the formal written method, carefully setting out their work and checking each step. They were encouraged to explain their thinking, use place value knowledge and they showed great focus and resilience when tackling more challenging calculations.



On Tuesday, Year 5 continued their P.E. unit on Tudor dance, focusing on motif and development. They explored how basic Tudor steps can be adapted and developed, creating their own original dance sequences.





This week, Year 2 enjoyed a very exciting visit to Key Stage 2, where they spent time with Miss Morgan's Year 4 class. The children proudly shared fascinating facts they had researched about creatures that live under the sea, reading with clear voices and great confidence. Everyone was impressed with their fluent and expressive reading, and it was a wonderful opportunity to build oracy skills while having lots of fun learning together. Well done Year 2!

In English, Year 5 have taken part in a lively debate on whether *The Highwayman* was a hero or a villain. The children developed their vocabulary and reasoning skills by using evidence from the text to support their arguments, confidently sharing and justifying their opinions in thoughtful discussions.





Year 5 have been busy in Forest School this week learning how to filter water. Working in teams, the children gathered natural resources and used them to create their own water filters. Through teamwork and problem-solving, they explored how water can be cleaned and developed their practical science skills in an engaging outdoor setting.



The boys' football team put in a fantastic performance in the quarter-final of the Heywood Cup against Inspire. After a closely fought match that ended 1–1 at full time, the game went into extra time. The team showed great determination and resilience, and it was Jack who scored the decisive winning goal. Goalkeeper James Corr was named Man of the Match by the referee for his incredible saves throughout the game. A brilliant team effort means Aldwyn are now through to the semi-finals – well done to everyone involved!





# Safer Internet Day & How We Stay Safe Online at Aldwyn All Year Round

Safer Internet Day takes place on 10th February this year, focusing on “Smart tech, safe choices – Exploring the safe and responsible use of AI.” While it’s an important annual reminder, at Aldwyn Primary School we believe that online safety is something we should support our children with throughout the entire year.

Many people will have seen recent news from Australia, where social media platforms have been banned for anyone under 16. While this isn’t the case in the UK, it highlights why it’s so important for our children to understand the risks of using social media and the possibility of being contacted by strangers online.

## Online Safety in Key Stage One

This article focuses on how we introduce online safety in Year 1 and Year 2, with a later article exploring the work we do higher up the school, including our Year 6 curriculum.

We begin by talking to children about the technology they use at home. Most younger pupils tell us they enjoy playing games, but many also watch videos on platforms like YouTube and TikTok.

A recent quick survey showed that tablets are the most common device children use to access the internet, closely followed by mobile phones. Some children even have phones of their own, which they use mainly for games and videos. Reassuringly, most children say parents and carers keep a close eye on what they are doing online.

To help children understand how to stay safe, we use a video called “Buddy the Dog’s Internet Safety Story.” Together, we explore possible online problems and learn a catchy song that helps children remember what to do if they ever feel unsure or worried.



### Stranger Danger – Online and Offline

In Years 1 and 2, we also teach a topic called “Stranger Danger.” Children learn that sometimes people they don’t know may try to contact them through games or apps. We talk about that uneasy “Oh No” feeling and what to do when something doesn’t feel right.

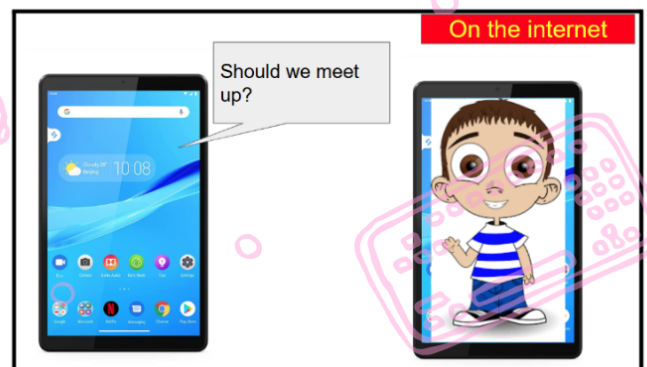
During our lessons, children take part in interactive activities, calling out what they should or shouldn’t do in different situations. We link these discussions to real-life safety as well as online safety.

Children learn seven golden rules, including:

- “I must ask a grown-up before playing a game.”
- “People you don’t know are strangers.”

The core message for our pupils is simple:

***If something worries you—online or in real life—always talk to a trusted adult.***



*All staff at Aldwyn have received e-safety training and are ready to support any child who may have concerns about their online world.*

### Building Confidence for a Digital Future

We know that children will continue using the internet, watching videos and eventually exploring social media, so it’s essential that we equip them with the skills, knowledge and resilience to stay safe.

In our next article, we’ll share how we prepare older pupils for the challenges they may face online, including fake news, phishing, and online scams

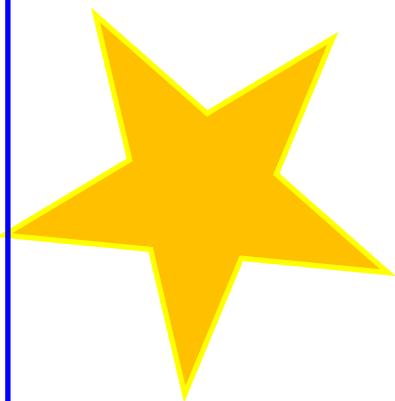




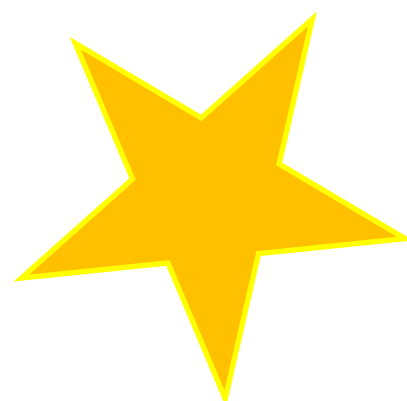
