Year 3 Bring Ancient Egypt to Life!

Year 3 have proudly put the finishing touches on their fantastic 1922-style newspapers, reporting on the dramatic discovery of a new tomb in the Valley of the Kings!

Over the past few weeks, the children have been developing their digital skills by using desktop publishing software to create their own versions of the *Cairo Times*. Inspired by the real discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, their newspapers didn't just retell history, they went one step further by announcing the discovery of a brand-new Pharaoh!

Using a combination of imagination and modern technology, pupils brought their own Pharaohs (and Pharaoh Queens!) to life. With the help of AI tools, they transformed their own photographs into ancient Egyptians, imagined the discovery of their mummy, and even designed a stunning golden death mask.

To complete their reports, the children wrote short newspaper articles, giving each discovery a unique name and story. Their finished work was printed for them to take home and proudly share with family members.

This has been a highly creative and exciting project, combining history, writing, technology, and art. Year 3 have shown fantastic enthusiasm and creativity throughout - well done to everyone for a job brilliantly done!

This week in Science, Year 4 have been learning about human teeth as part of their topic on the digestive system. To bring their learning to life, they enjoyed a practical activity where they had a go at making their own model teeth. It was a fantastic hands-on experience that helped the children develop a deeper understanding of the structure and function of our teeth while having lots of fun!

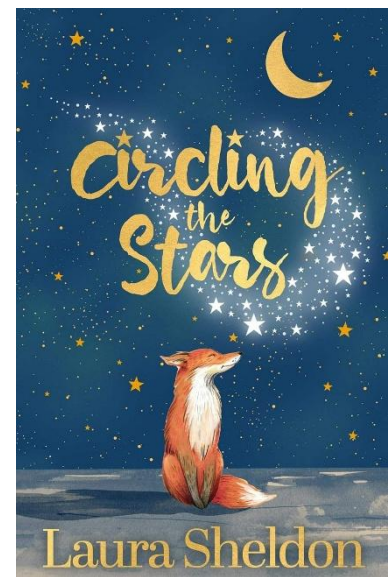

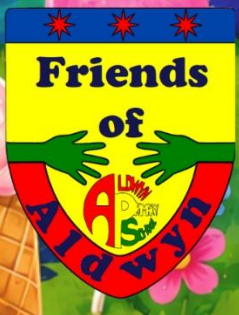
