



During the beginning of June, Year 1 pupils undertook the national phonic screening assessment. Year 2 pupils, who did not meet the 'expected' standard in 2025, also took the assessment.

This year, the 'expected' standard was set nationally at a score of at least 31 out of 40.

A score of 30 or less shows a child is 'working towards' the expected standard.

A score of 31 or more shows a child is 'working at' the expected standard.

Children's development in learning to read happens at different rates. All of our children have made fantastic progress in learning to read this year. For those children who are working towards the expected standard, ongoing support will continue to be in place to support children within phonics for the remainder of Year 1 and into Year 2. Support may include, targeted 1 to 1 /small group phonic sessions, additional reading support, personalised intervention matched to your child's individual needs and sound cards/QR codes sent home.

All children continue with Phonics in Year 2. In Year 2 children learn to become more fluent readers, develop their comprehension/understanding of texts and continue to learn any sounds they have not learnt yet.
